

The Plastic Film Challenge is over at School* but Keep Recycling Plastic Bags

WHAT TO RECYCLE

- Retail, carryout, produce, newspaper, bread, and dry-cleaning bags (clean, dry and free of receipts and clothes hangers)
- Zip-top food storage bags (clean and dry)
- Plastic shipping envelopes (remove labels), bubble wrap and air pillows (deflate)
- Product wrap on cases of water/soda bottles, paper towels, napkins, disposable cups, bathroom tissue, diapers, and female sanitary products
- Furniture and electronic wrap
- Plastic cereal box liners (but if it tears like paper, do not include)

DO NOT RECYCLE

- Degradable/compostable bags or film packaging
- Pre-washed salad mix bags
- Frozen food bags
- Candy bar wrappers
- Chip bags
- Six-pack rings

HOW TO RECYCLE

To recycle your plastic film, first make sure that it is clean (e.g., no food residue) and dry. Then, take it to your nearest drop-off location to be collected for recycling. Sometimes recycling your plastic film is as easy as taking it with you on your next trip to the grocery store!



DROP-OFF LOCATIONS

- Allegany County Recycling Center – Kelly Road – Container for Plastic Film in the same area as the Cardboard Recycling, look for the label.
- Kohl's LaVale – Customer Service Desk
- Martin's Market LaVale & Cumberland – Bins in Vestibule
- WEIS Cresaptown & Frostburg – Bin outside store or service desk
