Plastics Recycling



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Third grade students in Mrs. Sarah Llewellyn's class at Westernport Elementary School recently wrote to the Mayor of the Town of Westernport in an effort to persuade him to make plastic recycling easier for the citizens. The students' request was successful because Mayor Daniel Laffey was able to obtain #1 plastic recycling bins for the town. The students had the opportunity to visit Town Hall to learn about local government as well as visit the new plastic drop-off recycling center across from the entrance to the American Legion.

Students at WES are participating this year in Second Step, an evidence-based social-emotional learning curriculum, which improves the lives of over 10 million U.S. students every year. When

students are better equipped to manage their own emotions and build positive relationships, they are better equipped to learn. The Second Step units include Skills for Learning, Empathy, Emotion Management and Problem Solving. The skills taught by classroom teachers are reinforced by Mrs. Barbara Amtower, guidance counselor, during her weekly lessons and by Mrs. Shelly Fitzgerald, LAP Room instructional assistant, during behavioral interventions. Second Step is designed to help the students acquire social and academic skills they need to be successful at school and in life.



Words of the Week

Westernport Elementary students in grades K to 5 are continuing to learn the "Words of the Week." These words are the critical verbs and critical nouns that each student should know and be able to explain. The "Words of the Week" are introduced on the morning announcements by Mrs. Fazenbaker, Teachers review the words in their classrooms and use the words and show examples of the words throughout the week. Posters showing the words are in hallways and classrooms. The definitions of the critical verbs and critical nouns on the posters were provided, with permission, from the book <u>Teaching</u> <u>the Critical Vocabulary of the Common</u> <u>Core</u>, by Marilee Sprenger.

The <u>critical verbs</u> are analyze, articulate, cite, compare, comprehend, contrast, delineate, demonstrate, describe, determine, develop, distinguish, draw, evaluate, explain, identify, infer, integrate, interpret, locate, organize, paraphrase, refer, retell, suggest, summarize, support, synthesize and trace.

The <u>critical nouns</u> are alliteration, analogy, argument, central idea/main idea, conclu-

sions, connections, connotative language, details, evidence, figurative language, illustrations, interaction, metaphor, mood, point of view, rhetoric, simile, stanza, structure, theme and tone.
