A Veterans Day program was held at Westernport Elementary School on Tuesday, November 13, 2018. Parents and community members, including veterans from the Tri-Towns area, were invited to attend. Students in grades 3, 4 & 5 presented a musical program called "A Celebration of Peace", which commemorated the 100th anniversary of the end of World War I.

After the singing of the Star Spangled Banner and Those Who Served, veterans from the Air Force, Army, Coast Guard, Marines and Navy were recognized as their service songs were sung. Fifth grade students then explained the significance of the songs from WWI, as they were presented. These songs included Over There, Keep the Home Fires Burning, Don't Forget the Red Cross Nurse, and Pack Up Your Troubles and Smile, Smile. Smile. The finale included The Bells of Peace, which were rung 21 times by students playing handbells, joining a nationwide observance of the Armistice.

Words of the Week

Westernport Elementary students in grades K to 5 are continuing to learn the "Words of the Week." These words are the critical verbs and critical nouns that each student should know and be able to explain. The "Words of the Week" are introduced on the morning announcements by Mrs. Fazenbaker, Teachers review the words in their classrooms and use the words and show examples of the words throughout the week. Posters showing the words are in hallways and classrooms. The definitions of the critical verbs and critical nouns on the posters were provided, with permission, from the book <u>Teaching</u> <u>the Critical Vocabulary of the Common</u> <u>Core</u>, by Marilee Sprenger.

The <u>critical verbs</u> are analyze, articulate, cite, compare, comprehend, contrast, delineate, demonstrate, describe, determine, develop, distinguish, draw, evaluate, explain, identify, infer, integrate, interpret, locate, organize, paraphrase, refer, retell, suggest, summarize, support, synthesize and trace.

The <u>critical nouns</u> are alliteration, analogy, argument, central idea/main idea, conclu-

sions, connections, connotative language, details, evidence, figurative language, illustrations, interaction, metaphor, mood, point of view, rhetoric, simile, stanza, structure, theme and tone.


