Help Your Children to "Do Their Best on the Test!"

Students in fifth grade will be taking the Maryland Integrated Science Assessment (MISA) in March. They will be using computers to complete this test. Then all students in third, fourth and fifth grade in Allegany County will be taking the Partnership for Assessment of College and Careers (PARCC) test during the "window" of April 9-May 18, 2018. The PARCC test is an assessment of both reading and math achievement that meets the testing requirements of the No Child Left Behind Act. Students will use a computer to take both the reading and math tests. Here are test taking tips for you to share with your children in grades 3, 4 or 5.

Before a test

- · Get a good night's sleep.
- · Eat a good breakfast. (Students will be served breakfast each testing day.)
- · Come to school with a positive attitude.

During a test

- · Stay calm.
- · Listen carefully to the directions.
- · Focus on the task that you are being asked to complete.
- · Work at a steady pace and check your answers.

Do your best on Multiple Choice Questions by remembering to:

- · Read the question/problem and all answers carefully.
- · Cross out the wrong answers to eliminate unwanted choices.
- · Reread the questions and answers.
- · Check to make sure you have not left a question unanswered.
- · Carefully check your scrap paper answers with the answers on the test.

Do your best on Constructed Response Questions by remembering to:

- · Read the question/problem carefully.
- · Highlight words in the directions and other key words, as necessary.
- · THINK about your answer and organize it in your mind.
- · Enter your answer, work, or explanation in the box.
- · Use the Basic Equation Editor or Open Response Equation Editor, as needed,
- · Reread the problem, question, and answer to check your work...

Finally, you may go to parcc pearson.com/tutorial to help your child review. (Select Online Student tutorials, Grades 3-5 Math or Grades 3-5 ELA)

In math, for example, you will be able to see multiple choice, multiple select, drag and drop, Fill-in-the Blank, Hot-Spot-Items, Inline Choice and a drawing box. In ELA, you will find test samples for the English Language Arts. Your children should be familiar with these types of test questions.



Third, fourth and fifth grade students will know when they are testing and this information will be written in their assignment books to let you know as well. During the testing weeks, please make every attempt to get your child to school on time so he/she can eat breakfast and be prepared for the day. Please ensure that your child is well

rested. Please talk to your child about the testing and the importance of doing his/her best. We appreciate your cooperation in this matter.

Pre-Kindergarten and Kindergarten Registration will take place on April 5th and April 6th. Any student age four on or before September 1st may ap-

ply. Finally, it is important for your child to arrive to school on time every day and to not leave early from school, not just during testing days. When your child is

late to school or leaves early from school, he/she is missing valuable instruction that is hard to make up. Your child is considered tardy when he/she arrives after 8:45 AM. Classroom instruction runs to 3:20 PM every day. Please help your child by getting him/her to school on time and not picking your child up early so he/she may get ALL of the instruction every day.
