

## From the Principal...Mrs. Fazenbaker

The school year is well into the second semester and this year is definitely flying by. We recently held an awards assembly at WES. I was proud of all of the students who received awards for their hard work, citizenship and attendance during the second nine week grading period.

Spring pictures will be taken on Tuesday, March 26th. (Tell your children to bring their smiles!) Pre-Kindergarten and Kindergarten Registration will take place on April 4<sup>th</sup> and April 5<sup>th</sup>. Any student age four on or before September 1, 2019 may apply.

Gardner's Candy will be delivered to school on April 10th. A letter will be sent home to give details of the candy pickup. Thank you for your help with this fundraiser, and do enjoy eating the delicious candy with your families!

Fifth grade students will be taking the Maryland Integrated Science Assessment (MISA) on March 18<sup>th</sup> and 19<sup>th</sup>. The PARCC Testing window in Allegany County is from April 8<sup>th</sup> to May 17<sup>th</sup>. Third, fourth and fifth grade students will know when they are testing and the information will be written in their assignment books

to let you know as well. During the testing weeks, please make every attempt to get your child to school on time so he/she can eat breakfast and be prepared for the day. Please ensure that your child is well rested. Please talk to your child about the testing and the importance of doing his/her best. We appreciate your cooperation in this matter.

Finally, it is important for your child to arrive to school on time every day and to not leave early from school, not just during testing days. WES held the

first attendance incentive for students who were in school every day, did not come late or did not leave early during the time period of January 25<sup>th</sup> through February 25<sup>th</sup>. Seventy -five students were eligible to attend the incentive. The second attendance incentive is underway now and it began Friday, March 8<sup>th</sup>. Hopefully, your child will qualify to attend the next event!

#### Help Students to "Do Their Best on the Test!"



All students in third, fourth and fifth grade in Allegany County will be taking the Partnership for Assessment of College and Careers (PARCC) test during the "window" of April 8-May 17, 2019. The PARCC test is an assessment of both reading and math achievement that meets the testing requirements of the No Child Left Behind Act. Students will use a computer to take both the reading and math tests.

Here are test taking tips for you to share with your children in grades 3, 4 or 5.

#### Before a test

- · Get a good night's sleep.
- · Eat a good breakfast. (Students will be served breakfast each testing day.)
- · Come to school with a positive attitude.

#### During a test

- · Stay calm.
- · Listen carefully to the directions.
- · Focus on the task that you are being asked to complete.
- · Work at a steady pace and check your answers.

**Do your best** on **Multiple Choice Questions** by remembering to:

- Read the question/problem and all answers carefully.
- Cross out the wrong answers to eliminate unwanted choices.
- · Reread the questions and answers.
- Check to make sure you have not left a question unanswered.
- · Carefully check your scrap paper answers with the answers on the test.

## Do your best on Constructed Response Questions by remembering to:

- · Read the question/problem carefully.
- Highlight words in the directions and other key words, as necessary.
- THINK about your answer and organize it in your mind.
- Enter your answer, work, or explanation in the box.
- Use the Basic Equation Editor or Open Response Equation Editor, as needed.
- Reread the problem, question, and answer to check your work..

#### PBIS Dance Party

The Positive Behavioral Intervention and Supports (PBIS) Dance was held on Friday February 22, 2019. The criteria for students to earn a ticket each week was to have no referrals, no red behaviors and no more than one yellow behavior per week. The students started fresh each week, so that one referral did not take the entire treat away. Homework guidelines were at the discretion of the classroom teacher. In math, for example, you will be able to see multiple choice, multiple select, drag and drop, Fill-in-the Blank, Hot-Spot-Items, Inline Choice and a drawing box.

In Engish Language Arts/Literacy, you will find test samples for the that portion of the test. Your children should be familiar with these types of test questions.

#### Attendance Matters

It is important for your child to arrive to school on time every day and that your child not leave early from school, not just during testing days. When your child is late to school or leaves early from school, he/she is missing valuable instruction that is hard to make up. Your child is considered tardy when he/she arrives after 8:45 AM. Classroom instruction ends at 3:20 PM every day. Please get your child to school on time and avoid picking up your child early so he/she can receive a WHOLE day of instruction.
