JUST TO REVIEW ...

- Students that had currently opted out that wanted to opt-in back in for the fourth nine weeks had to contact their school administrator no later than March 31, 2021, for a return to in-person learning on Monday, April 12, 2021. Any student who did not meet this opt-in deadline must remain in virtual learning through the end of the school year.
- Beginning the week of April 12th, all students, including those students who have opted back in for the fourth nine weeks, will attend in person Monday through Thursday as follows:
- April 12-15, 2021: All students will attend school every day together for full days of in-person learning, including those students who opted back in for the fourth nine weeks
- Friday, April 16, 2021: Full day of asynchronous virtual learning for students and staff
- Beginning the week of April 19th through the remainder of the school year, all students will return to school for in-person learning Monday through Friday.



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Westernport Elementary School students participated (virtually) in the yearlong Stock Market Game, which is sponsored by the Maryland Council on Economic Éducation. The Stock Market Game (SMG) is an educational simulation that teaches students in grades 4-12 about the stock markets and the economy. Participants develop many new skills, while doing real-time investing and maintaining a stock portfolio by investing a hypothetical \$100,000 over about a six-month time period.

Due to the virtual setting, the fifth grade students worked as individuals and the fourth grade students worked as a group. WES had a total of seven teams in the statewide competition. The official game was held from September 14, 2020 and finished on April 9, 2021, but the WES teams did not "purchase" their stock until the first week of December.

All WES teams increased their hypothetical \$100,000 by at least \$12,000 by "buying" and "selling" stock. They invested in companies such as Apple, Disney, Hersey, McDonald's, Netflix, and Nike, as well as Bank of America, Coca Cola, Dollar General, DoorDash, Game Stop, Johnson & Johnson, Kellogg's, Lowe's, Microsoft, Moderna, Pfizer, Sony, Target, Under Armour, Walmart, and more.

Although the WES teams competed at the elementary level against 73 teams statewide, they were also ranked statewide among 338 elementary, middle and high school teams.

The fourth grade team, consisting of Maci Barbe, Aaliyiah Davis and Declan McGeady, finished in 13th place at the elementary level; then in 91st place, overall.

WES students have participated in the Stock Market Game for nine years. The school had first place regional winners in spring 2013, and a school team won the statewide yearlong competition in the spring of 2017. But in spite of the challenges due to the pandemic, playing the SMG in 2020-2021 proved to be a great experience for the participating student teams, which were coached by school teacher-librarian, Mrs. Deborah Hendrickson.
