The fifth grade will be starting their ELA assessments on Tuesday, May 1st. All three grades will complete the math portion of the PARCC assessment (with two days of testing for each grade level) by May 11th. Please get your children to school on time and have them well rested so that they will be ready for testing.

I would like to mention our **annual fundraisers**. WES holds two fundraisers, the Krispy Kreme Donut

sale and the Gardner's Candy sale. Proceeds from these fundraisers go directly to the students. This year, fundraiser profit was used to buy every student a class picture and helped to support activities associated with the PBIS Program at WES. Got Creativity?

Students have been experimenting in the library media center with Makerspaces for the past several years. Defining a makerspace can be somewhat difficult due to the differences among spaces and activities, but the emphasis is on creating with technology, according to Caitlin Bagley of Carnegie Library of Pittsburgh. Devices such as iPads, Kindles and Nooks and items such as little-Bits, Contraptions (wooden planks), K'nex, Q-Bits and Zoob pieces can also be used to encourage student creativity.
