Did you know that you can follow your child's progress in the Accelerated Reader program online?

With a few clicks of the mouse, you can go to the Renaissance Learning website, log in using the **Parent Link** and then view School-to Home Report. You can also see how your child has done on AR quizzes taken throughout the school year by viewing the Goals and Points and Student Record reports. Grade two students in Allegany County are examining soil to learn about an important natural resource and habitat and to focus on the composition and characteristics

of soil found in their own schoolyard. Students read and discussed a picture-book describing soil as habitat (Jump into Science: Dirt), and used this book to have a discussion of living and non-living things found in the soil - including foods they eat. Then students learned how, without plants, this important natural resource can be lost due to erosion. Students are working on this experiment as part of a Partners in Ecology and Restoration of Schoolyards (PIERS) schoolyard-Soil Habitat investigation.
