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Accelerated Reader Tips: Parent Link and AR Bookfinder



Did you know that you can follow your child's progress in the Accelerated Reader program online?

With a few clicks of the mouse, you can go to the Renaissance Learning website, log in using the **Parent Link** and then view School-to Home Report. You can also see how your child has done on AR quizzes taken throughout the school year by viewing the Goals and Points and Student Record reports. In addition, the names of the "Top Five" readers in each classroom and the monthly "Schoolwide Stars" are displayed on the bulletin board near the school office.

The online version of the AR program allows almost unlimited selection of books and quizzes, but a few older titles are not represented. You may use the AR Bookfinder to help your child

select books of personal interest and books that support your child's reading skills. It is a great way for your child to select AR books from the school and public libraries and from his/her classroom
