"Food, Fiber and You" Mobile Science Lab @ WES





Westernport Elementary School students recently participated in activities supported by grant funds supplied by the Maryland Agricultural Education Foundation, Inc. and Western Maryland Local Section of the American Chemical Society. Students in grades K-5 attended classes in the Mobile Science Lab which was parked right on the front lawn of the school. The activities included scientific investigations called "How Well Do You Wash?", "Extra Cheese, Please", "Seeds, Seeds, Seeds", "The Science of Chocolate" and "Yeast Action." In "How Well Do You Wash", seen above, fifth grade students applied a special solution to their hands, then examined their hands under a black light. Students tried different methods to reduce the amount of bacteria, including hand sanitizer, alcohol wipes, soap and water and just plain water. Students used their math skills to estimate the original amount of bacteria and to conclude how much bacteria was left after washing with the different products. The students concluded that handwashing for 20 seconds was the best way to remove bacteria. It was a great week.

Accelerated Reader Tips: Parent Link



Did you know that you can follow your child's progress in the Accelerated Reader program online?

With a few clicks of the mouse, you can go to the Renaissance Learning website, log in using the **Parent Link** and then view School-to Home Report. You can also see how your child has done on AR quizzes taken throughout the school year by viewing the Goals and Points and Student Record reports. so that she may send you a secure log-in and password.

In addition, the names of the "Top Five" readers in each classroom and the monthly "Schoolwide Stars" are displayed on the bulletin board near the school office.

The online version of the AR program allows almost unlimited selection of books and quizzes, but a few older titles are not represented. You may use the AR Bookfinder to help your child

select books of personal interest and books that support your child's reading skills. It is a great way for your child to select AR books from the school and public libraries and from his/her classroom

Travel Safely to School

Please have your children in the appropriate child restraint when bringing your children to school in your vehicle. Deputy Darrell Wildesen, our resource officer, will be checking to make sure that all of our students are safe and secure in vehicles. The current law requires that children under eight years old or 80 pounds in weight are to be in a child restraint unless the child is 4'9" or taller. Every child from 8 to 16 years old who is not secured in a child restraint must be secured in the vehicle's seat belt, in every sitting position in the vehicle. The fine for not having a child secured is \$83.00, which includes court costs. Thank you for your consideration of this matter.

Red Ribbon Week

Westernport Elementary School celebrated Red Ribbon Week on Monday, October 22nd through Friday, October 26th. Red Ribbon Week began in 1985 as a means of honoring D.E.A. agent Enrique Camarena, who gave his life fighting the war against drugs. Red Ribbon Week reminds students how to make healthy choices. Students learn why drugs are dangerous and how to say no to drugs. This year's national theme is: "Your Future Is Key, So Stay Drug Free."
