Westernport Elementary School now has a book vending machine! Classroom teachers award two book tokens each month. Book tokens are given to students who have achieved excellence, made great progress and/or been a hard worker in the subject of English Language

Arts (ELA). Students may also receive a book token by participating in a monthly drawing held in the school library. Please have your children in the appropriate child restraint when bringing your children to school in your vehicle for any reason. Maryland's Child Passenger Safety Law requires that children under eight years old or 80 pounds in weight are to be in a child restraint unless the child is 4'9" or taller. Every child from 8 to 16 years old who is not secured in a child restraint must be secured in the vehicle's seat belt, in every sitting position in the vehicle. The fine for not having a child secured is \$83.00, which includes court costs.

Fall/Winter Activities @WES






Title I Tip #3

October and November guidance and social skills lessons focused on bullying prevention and recognizing the signs of bullying. To further help our school be a safe and respectful place, we utilize the Second Step Bullying Prevention Unit. In this unit, your child learns specific skills to help stop bullying. Students learned how to:

- Recognize when bullying is happening, report bullying to a caring adult, and how to refuse to let bullying happen;
- •Be a bystander who helps stop bullying (another term is "upstander...); •Support someone being bullied by standing up for that person and being kind and inclusive; and
- •Recognize, report, and refuse cyber bullying when they see or know about it happening.

Get involved in making our school a safe and respectful place by letting us know if you hear about bullying at our school. Make sure your child knows to tell you or someone at school if he or she is being bullied, or if he or she knows about someone else being bullied. For more information on our school's anti-bullying policy and specific procedures, check our school website or contact the school office. Thank you for helping us make our school a safe, respectful place where everyone can learn!

Ms. Tessa and Mrs. Wilson also started supporting students through small group instruction during the past month. This is a wonderful opportunity for students to work collaboratively with others on subjects such as social skills, self control, and anxiety. Small group instruction takes place during extra library media/social skills classes or during students' lunch times. During the month of December, students will learn the character trait of the month, "Integrity", and continue to practice and review their TOOLBOX tools - ask your student to teach you about the breathing tool!
