

There are many ways to provide reading opportunities for your child.

\*Encourage your child to borrow print books as well as eBooks from the Westernport Elementary School Library. Go to the WES Home Page (Bookmarks) https://www.acpsmd.org/domain/515 Click on Follett Destiny (Tree icon). Have your child log in with google. That will allow your child to check out an ebook (or two or three...) or read an interactive ebook, in addition to the book (s) that he/she borrows from the library. (The interactive ebooks may be read online and do not need to be checked out.) \*\*\*Explore with your child more than 8,000 interactive ebooks available in my-ON (My Online Library)!

Go to the WES Home Page (Bookmarks). https://www.acpsmd.org/domain/515 Have your child click on Clever, log in with google, then click on the "R" Renaissance icon which will lead to the myON app on the left of the screen. Click on the

"Library, Recommended and/or Search" buttons to find ebooks of interest. \*\*\*Explore the books and online materials available at any of the six branches of the Allegany County Public System by going to www.alleganycountylibrary.info or have your child click on the Allegany County Library System logo on the WES Home Page (Bookmarks) Your child may use his/her regular library card number or virtual STAR card number to log into BookFlix, library databases or to check out ebooks or audiobooks. The Westernport Branch is open on Mondays from 1:00-8:00 PM and

## Safety is #1

Please have your children in the appropriate child restraint when bringing your children to school in your vehicle for any reason. Maryland's Child Passenger Safety Law requires that children under eight years old or 80 pounds in weight are to be in a child restraint unless the child is 4'9" or taller. Every child from 8 to 16 years old who is not secured in a child restraint must be secured in the vehicle's seat belt, in every sitting position in the vehicle. The fine for not having a child secured is \$83.00, which includes court costs.

## Children's Author, Kristen Kladstrup, Visits WES



On December 5, 2025, author Kristin Kladstrup visited WES as part of the school's partnership with the FSU Children's Literature Centre. Ms. Kladstrup told students that "as a writer, she makes things up" and it is really fun to do so. She also told them that their young brains have even more imagination than she does and encouraged them to write stories. Ms. Kladstrup read her picture book, The Gingerbread Pirates to students. After the story, she told students that she gets her ideas from simple things that she notices and shared her four rules of writing. They are 1) Stories need to have a beginning, middle and end and the story needs to connect all the way through; 2) Stories involve change; 3) You (as a reader) have to care about the characters and their point of view; and 4) You (as an author) need to care about the reader. She also commented that reading (a lot) has made her a better writer.

Ms. Kadstrup's day job is to edit math curriculum. But about 20 years ago she decided to try to write a book and now is the author of five books! She grew up in Sioux City, Iowa but now lives in Boston, Massachusetts with her husband and two sons. She said on her website that "I like reading and writing (obviously!). I also like to play the piano, ride my bicycle, and go on hikes with family and friends." Students in grades K-2 received a copy of <a href="The Gingerbread Pirate">The Gingerbread Pirate</a>. Students in grades 3-5 received a copy of her chapter book called <a href="Nutcracker Mice">Nutcracker Mice</a>.

## Counselor's Corner



October and November guidance and social skills lessons focused on bullying prevention and recognizing the signs of bullying. To further help our school be a safe and respectful place, we utilize the Second Step Bullying Prevention Unit. In this unit, your child learns specific skills to help stop bullying. Students learned how to:

- Recognize when bullying is happening, report bullying to a caring adult, and how to refuse to let bullying happen;
- ·Be a bystander who helps stop bullying (another term is "upstander...);
- ·Support someone being bullied by standing up for that person and being kind and inclusive; and
- Recognize, report, and refuse cyber bullying when they see or know about it happening.

Parents, please get involved in making our school a safe and respectful place by letting us know if you hear about bullying at our school. Make sure your child knows to tell you or someone at school if he or she is being bullied, or if he or she knows about someone else being bullied. For more information on our school's anti-bullying policy and specific procedures, check our school website or contact the school office. Thank you for helping us make our school a safe, respectful place where everyone can learn!
