It has become a long-standing tradition in our Accelerated Reader program at Westernport Elementary School to have incentive prizes to recognize students who have worked exceptionally hard to "read-read" and "test-test-test."

This year, 48 student "winners" will travel by school bus to Moon Glo Skating Rink in Cumberland on Thursday, November 5, 2015. (This trip will be from 3:30 to 7:30 p.m.)

The <u>top six students in each grade</u> who pass a minimum number of AR Practice Quizzes as well as <u>earn the most Accelerated</u> <u>Reader points</u> by taking AR Reading Practice Quizzes from **September 8**, 2015 to October 23, 2015 will be invited to attend this trip. All other students who pass a minimum number of AR Reading Practice quizzes during the contest will be eligible to be in a drawing to select <u>six more</u> <u>winners, per grade</u>. The minimum quizzes required are:

Grade two (2 quizzes), Grade three (3 quizzes), Grade four (4 quizzes) and Grade five (5 quizzes)

To prevent indiscriminate quizzing, students who are in the "top six" or students who pass the minimum number of quizzes also must have an <u>average</u> of 70% of quiz questions correctly answered to be eligible to attend this trip.

Please encourage your child to partici-

pate in the Accelerated Reader program this fall so that he/she will have a chance to attend this trip. AR Quizzes may be taken in the computer lab during lunch/play on MONDAYS and TUES-DAYS for grades 4 & 5 and THURS-DAYS and FRIDAYS for grades 2 & 3. Students may also take quizzes in their classrooms at their teachers' convenience.

Parents who wish to view their children's progress during the contest (or at any time) may request parent access to a secure Renaissance Learning website by e-mailing Mrs. Hendrickson (Deborah.Hendrickson@acpsmd.org) or making a request on the AR site.

Ways to Support WES

A school lunch is now \$2.45 (full price) and \$.40 (reduced price). Please pay your child's lunch bill on time with cash, check or PayPAM. You may pay everyday or send in money for a week or month at a time. This way you can assure that your child will have money in his/her account. If your child charges five meals or \$12.25, he/she will receive a substitute meal of 1/2 cup vegetable, 1/2 cup fruit and half pint milk.

Fire Prevention Week is October 4-10, 2015

No one wants to hear the sound of sirens as fire trucks scream through the streets. But fires are a reality. **Fire Prevention Week is October 5-11th** and The National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) uses this as an opportunity to educate students and parents about fire safety. This year's theme is "Hear the Bleep Where You Sleep. Every Bedroom Needs a Working Smoke Alarm." Once a fire starts in your home, you may have as little as two minutes to escape. Advance planning and a practiced fire escape route can save lives. NFPA suggests the following when making an escape plan for your family:

- Have two ways out of every room in your house.
- Have the number to call in case of a fire emergency posted near the phone.
- Establish a place outside for members of the family to meet in case the house must be evacuated.
- Make sure bedroom windows open easily for a possible escape route.
- Have children practice opening doors and windows until you know they can do this easily.
- Test smoke alarms regularly and change the batteries at least once a year.
- If the house has a second floor, have an escape ladder that can be dropped down from the upstairs window.

NFPA also stresses general fire prevention and lists a series of checks to be made in the home to lessen the chances for a fire. Visit http://www.nfpa.org/safety-information/for-consumers/escape-planning

Fire Drill Procedures @ WES

Maps which show building evacuation routes have been posted throughout WES. These maps may be found in all classroom doorways and in other locations such as the



cafeteria, gym, computer lab and office. If you are a parent volunteer or visitor to WES, you are expected to exit the building when the fire alarm rings or if there is a scheduled fire drill. Please assist to close all doors and windows, as necessary, and turn off the lights before

proceeding to the playground blacktop area via the east (McDonald's side), west (Alley side) or Cafeteria Lobby doors.

Please take a moment to become familiar with evacuation routes so that you may safely exit WES.
