Veterans Day & Christmas Programs 2016

This year, the primary and intermediate classes at Westernport Elementary School will be divided for special holiday programs. The third, fourth and fifth grade students will be performing the Veterans Day program on Monday, November 7th at 1:45 PM. This is a yearly program that Westernport Elementary School does to honor all veterans that have a tie to our school, whether it be as a member of our community or a relative of a student who attends here. The annual Christmas Program will be presented this year by our pre-k, kindergarten, first and second grade students on Tuesday, December 20th at 1:45 PM. In recent years, all grade levels have participated in this program; however with the smaller number of grade levels performing, the students will be given more time on stage for their parents/grandparents to enjoy. We are making this necessary change for several reasons. We work hard to ensure the safety of all our students; however when we have extremely large audiences for this program, it is difficult to manage. We are always conscious of the Maryland State Fire Marshal Regulations and with the large number attending the Christmas program, we are not in compliance. Another concern is the parking for such a large audience. Even with teachers parking in the field, there is still not enough parking. Accelerated Reader Contests 2016-2017



There will be three Accelerated Reader contests during 2016-2017.

September 6-November 7, 2016: AR Coloring Craze Contest

Students will win small prizes (bookmarks to color) for passing AR quizzes during play period. At the end of the contest, students will participate in a drawing based on number of AR points earned. Each student who earns one AR point will have one ticket with his/her name on it placed in the drawing. A student who earns two points at the end will earn two tickets, etc. There will be four "buckets" so students will just be competing against students in their own grade level. Students may use their TOPS papers to watch their progress, but do not need to turn them in to Mrs. Hendrickson. Book Fair gift certificates and small prizes will be

awarded to the winners.

January-Mid-March: Winter AR Contest (theme yet to be determined)

Skate to Your AR Goal (year-long event)

48 student "winners" will travel by school bus to Moon Glo Skating Rink in Cumberland on Thursday, May 4, 2017. (This trip will be from 3:30 to 7:30 p.m.)

The top six students in each grade who pass a minimum number of AR Practice Quizzes as well as earn the most Accelerated Reader points by taking AR Reading Practice Quizzes throughout the entire school year will be invited to attend this trip.

All other students who pass a minimum number of AR Reading Practice quizzes during the entire school year will be eligible to be in a drawing to select six more

winners, per grade. (Eight quizzes in grade 2, twelve quizzes in grade 3, sixteen quizzes in grade 4 and 20 quizzes in grade 5.)

To prevent indiscriminate quizzing, students who are in the "top six" or students who pass the minimum number of quizzes also must have an average of 70% of quiz questions correctly answered to be eligible to attend.

AR Quizzes may be taken in the computer lab during after lunch play period on **MON-DAYS and TUESDAYS for grades 2, 3, 4 & 5.** Students may also take quizzes in their classrooms at their teachers' convenience. The AR program has been synched with the results of your child's STAR Reading diagnostic test results (grades 3, 4 & 5 only) to encourage your child to read and test on books that are not too easy, and not too hard, but "just right."

Meet the (New) Faculty and Staff

A school lunch is now \$2.55 (full price) and \$.40 (reduced price). Please pay your child's lunch bill on time with cash, check or Pay-PAM. You may pay everyday or send in money for a week or month at a time. This way you can assure that your child will have money in his/her account.

If your child charges five meals or \$12.25 (or \$2.00 charged for five reduced meals), he/she will receive a substitute meal of 1/2 cup vegetable, 1/2 cup fruit and half pint milk.

Fire Prevention Week is October 9-15, 2016

No one wants to hear the sound of sirens as fire trucks scream through the streets. But fires are a reality. **Fire Prevention Week is October 9-15th** and The National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) uses this as an opportunity to educate students and parents about fire safety. This year's theme is "Don't Wait - Check the Date! Replace Smoke Alarms Every 10 Years." Once a fire starts in your home, you may have as little as two minutes to escape. Advance planning and a practiced fire escape route can save lives. NFPA suggests the following when making an escape plan for your family:

- Have two ways out of every room in your house.
- Have the number to call in case of a fire emergency posted near the phone.
- Establish a place outside for members of the family to meet in case the house must be evacuated.
- Make sure bedroom windows open easily for a possible escape route.
- Have children practice opening doors and windows until you know they can do this easily.
- Test smoke alarms regularly and change the batteries at least once a year.
- If the house has a second floor, have an escape ladder that can be dropped down from the upstairs window.

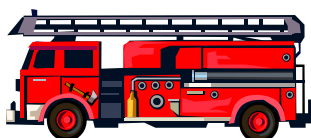
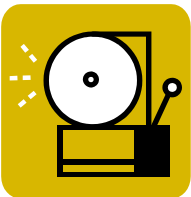
Peace Days Winners
