The dental team will be visiting each school to provide the sealants. Parents are encouraged to complete the permission form (which will be sent home soon) so that your child may benefit from this program. If your child has already received dental sealants, this is a chance for the teeth to be checked and re-sealed, if needed. Dental sealants are applied to the chewing surfaces of the back teeth where tooth decay occurs most often. The sealant acts as a barrier, protecting the teeth from plaque and acids that cause tooth decay. 
Citizens of the Month

Accelerated Reader News



A.R. has begun for 2018-2019! September 4, 2018 was the first day for students to participate and the beginning of the 28th year of the Accelerated Reader program at WES. We are using the online version of the program (in school only) in grades 2, 3, 4, and 5.

What is Accelerated Reader? Accelerated Reader is a computerized reading program that allows each student to move at his or her own pace and level of ability, with its goal being to have students read more, and to select better books. This is how the program works. Each child chooses a book from a group of carefully selected children's books, which are available at the school or public library. (There are now over 170,000 books listed in the AR Bookfinder (http://www.arbookfind.com),

which is linked to the school website.) Each book has been evaluated as to

reading level and length. Based on these two factors, each book is assigned a point value. After reading the book, the child goes to a computer to take a quiz. The quiz measures the child's comprehension of the book. The child then receives a number of incentive points, which are based on the percentage of questions answered correctly. Students are encouraged to take Accelerated Reader quizzes on books read as a group in the classroom, as appropriate. Students are also encouraged to take quizzes on books of personal interest.

Changes for 2018-2019: AR quizzes may be taken by students in grades 2 & 3 in the computer lab during after lunch playtime on MONDAYS ONLY. Mrs. Hendrickson will assist younger students to log into and read the quizzes. Older students may take quizzes in library classes or in their

homerooms at their teachers' convenience, as time permits, or drop in to the library. It is important that older students challenge themselves with higher-level books. So the AR program will again be synched with the results of the Scholastic Reading Inventory, which was given to students in grades four and five. Older students will still be able to take a wide range of AR quizzes, but the computer will not allow them to take quizzes way below grade level.

Incentives: Points and amount of quizzes passed, by homeroom, will be used to determine monthly winners of small reading incentives. Winners will be posted on the bulletin board on second floor next to the entrance to the library media center. Top students will also be recognized at a special "end of year" event. Please encourage your child to participate in Accelerated Reader.

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Recycling Continues @WES





Plastič "film" recycling will begin in October. This is a school-wide recycling effort, so all students, teachers and parents are asked to help. If you wish to participate, please send in the following items: grocery bags, wood pellet bags, bread bags, case overwrap, dry cleaning bags, newspaper sleeves, ice bags, wood pellet bags, ziplock & other re-sealable bags, produce bags, bubble wrap, salt bags, and cereal bags. Do not send in plastic bottles and plastic containers. All materials must be clean, dry and free of food residue.


Other items which can be recycled are being collected in bins on each floor. They are **clean** glue bottles, clean glue sticks, broken crayons and used markers. Fire Prevention Week is October 7-13, 2018

No one wants to hear the sound of sirens as fire trucks scream through the streets. But fires are a reality. Fire Prevention Week is October 7th-13th and The National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) uses this as an opportunity to educate students and parents about fire safety. - Learn two ways out of each room


