Greg was a 1970 graduate. During his time at Fort Hill, Greg was a member of NHS and lettered 3 years in football, basketball and baseball, and subsequently was recruited by many colleges for all 3 sports as well as entertaining major league baseball offers. Greg ultimately signed a four-year football scholarship to attend The Ohio State University.

During college, he started 15 games as quarterback and started in the Rose Bowl his junior year. Greg was chosen by his teammates to serve as co-captain his senior year. Greg was ultimately drafted to the Buffalo Bills and after a short time there, was recruited by the Calgary Stampeders in Canada. In 1975, Greg was hired by Xerox Corporation where he was on the Xerox Honor Council 11 years and in 1980, he earned the distinction of #1 sales representative in the Eastern Region of the US as well as the #3 Sales Representative in America.

While at Xerox, Greg continued his love of football by playing minor league professionally in Chambersburg, PA where he led the team to 3 national championships and 15 league championships. Over a seven-season span, the team won 78 straight football games and collectively 102 out of 103 games. Greg was nominated as the Player of the Year five times and was nominated into the Minor Professional Football Hall of Fame and currently holds the honor as the number 2 passing quarterback in the history of minor professional football.

Following his Xerox Career, Greg started his own company Document Solutions, Inc and has generated over \$100,000,000 in sales revenue for Western MD. His company has accumulatively donated in excess of \$1,000,000 as part of his company's commitment to give back to the community. Greg personally donated \$50,000 to the Western MD Health System's Capital Fund Campaign.

Over the years, Greg has helped a multitude of local quarterbacks. He helped coach in youth leagues as well as serving as Offensive Coordinator for Fort Hill and FSU. Greg has sat on numerous boards and now has the pleasure of sitting on The Greenway Avenue Stadium Capital Improvement Fund Board continuing to show support of our community and our youth through working to provide a state-of-the-art stadium.
