Oral/Maxillofacial Surgeons

Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery is the specialty of dentistry which includes the diagnosis, surgical and adjunctive treatment of disease, injuries and defects involving both the functional and esthetic aspects of the hard and soft tissues of the oral and maxillofacial region.

Education: Four Years of Dental School and Four Years in a Surgical Hospital Residency.

Such a surgeon may make \$166,400 yearly.





ORTHOPEDIC SURGEON

- Education: Bachelors Degree, Medical School, and 5 years of residency specializing in orthopedics
- Salary: The Average yearly income of a surgeon during to year of 2008 was \$206,770
- Job Description: Surgeons treat and correct injuries, diseases, and deformities by operating on patients. An orthopedic surgeon specialized in orthopedics, or skeletal surgery.






Astronaut

(Commander and pilot)

- Astronaut requirements: Bachelor's degree in math, engineering, biological science, or physical science. 1000 hours of flight time in a jet aircraft. Have to pass the NASA space physical which consists of 20/100 vision or better uncorrected, 20/20 each eye corrected, 140/90 blood pressure in a sitting position, and a height between 62 and 75 inches.
- Median salary for an astronaut is \$55,000.
- The term "astronaut" derives from the Greek words meaning "space sailor," and refers to all who have been launched as crew members aboard NASA spacecraft bound for orbit and beyond.





Aerospace Technician

- •Work with air and spacecraft.
- •The education of a technician is not as rigorous as an engineers.
- •Recommended to have at least an associates degree in programs of engineering and hands-on learning lab work or real-world experience.
- •The average technician made \$52,250 in 2004.

Mortician

The median salary for a mortician is \$48,592. A mortician is involved in embalming as well as the dressing of the body to make it look presentable to the family.

Most modern day morticians hire up to three other morticians to aid in the processes of a mortician. The aid usually comes from within the family prolonging the family business and keeping the family name in the company.




Physicist

- A physicist is a scientist who practices or studies physics.
- They observe and study all levels of physics from subatomic particles to enormous universal bodies.
- Most positions require a doctoral degree. At the master's level and higher, students tend to specialize in a particular field. Sometimes post doctoral experience is also required.

Employment

- Most physicist work at
 - Academic institutions
 - Government agencies
 - Private Companies
- The average salary for a physicist is around \$72,910 to \$117,080





Astronomeronomer

- from \$70,000 to \$140,000.
- Most astronomers have PhD in the subject. This requires anywhere from 7 to 11 years or more of schooling after high school.
- Much research must be done for the aspiring astronomer to gain a PhD.
 These projects must be completed for the degree and range greatly in the time that they take.
- After graduating the astronomers must write postdocs to establish themselves in the astronomy community.
- Many astronomers end up teaching the subject in a college setting or do research work at a research institution.



MECHANICAL ENGINEER

- -Mechanical engineers develop new and improved theories and methods and tools to be used.
- -They go to school for their Bachelor's degree, which takes 4-5 years.
- -The typical engineer starts off making \$66,320 a year.

What Is It and Salary

- This career is a subspecialty that deals with the digestive tract and problems within that tract.
- These doctors are trained in the diagnosis, treatment, and management of problems arising in the pancreas, liver, colon, esophagus, and stomach.
- Average salary in the U.S. is \$317,903.

Schooling

Thirteen year minimum including classroom study and on site training. Excel and complete a four year college to enter medical school and develop skills in writing and communication. Earn a medical degree and prepare to focus on internal medicine. Complete a three year residency in internal medicine to understand how all the body organs function and relate to one another. Participation in a two to three year fellowship program is then advised as well as required on the job training courses and hands on experiences. Finally, you must learn to perform diagnostic procedures like colonoscopies.
