Prolonged State of Emergency Virtual Education Plan

- Plan to be used during a prolonged State of Emergency
- Senate Bill requirement
 - Senate Bill 610 defines a State of Emergency as "declared by the Governor, that it prevents in school attendance in a public school for at least 14 consecutive days."
- Required to include several different components
 - Staffing and personnel assignments
 - Student instructional plan for virtual learning
 - Social and emotional supports that will be given
 - Communication plan
 - Technology plan
 - Food Services plan
 - Return to in person learning plan
- ACPS will consult with County Government and the Health Department as necessary
- Draft plan was sent to principals for their input and recommendations have been integrated into the plan as needed
- o Plan will be sent to MSDE by June 1
- Will need to be updated every two years

Maryland Report Card Update / Science Assessment

- Starting in 2023-2024 school year, for first-time ninth graders, the American Government and the Life Science Maryland Integrated Science Assessment End of Course Exams will count for 20% of the student's final grades.
- These exams shift the emphasis from high-stakes testing to teacher instruction with 80% of a student's course grade based on locally created, teacher-designed content.
- MSDE identified Maryland public schools earning a 1 or 2 start rating in the Maryland's Accountability System in two of the last three available years of data
 - ACPS had one school identified
