


NURSE'S CORNER

Staying Healthy During Cold & Flu Season

From physicians to the national Centers for Disease Control, experts agree – with the cold and flu season, the best way to combat the flu and other illnesses this season is through preventive measures. Getting influenza (flu) vaccine is your best defense against getting the flu, but use the following tips to fight the flu and other illnesses:

- ★ Wash your hands frequently with soap and water for 20 seconds or use hand sanitizing gel.
- ★ Get the flu vaccine as soon as it becomes available, and discuss with your health care provider if you are due for other vaccinations.
- ★ Stay home and limit your contact with others, especially if you are sick.
- ★ Cover your nose and mouth with a face covering in public places.
- ★ Avoid touching your nose, mouth and eyes.
- ★ Use tissues for coughs and sneezes and dispose of them in the trash.
- ★ Avoid large groups and practice physical distancing (stay at least 6 feet away from others) even when wearing a face covering or outside.





Hi there and Happy Holidays!


We are having so much fun in Pre-K crafting and getting ready for the upcoming holidays. Along with crafting, we have been busy growing our brains and getting smarter each and every day!

We have finished our first rotation of learning the alphabet where we focused on letter recognition and now we are on our second rotation and will focus on learning letter sounds! We are also sharpening up our rhyming skills, blending and decoding words, and are getting really good at onset fluency.

In math, we are focusing on shapes and how they are all around us. Recently, students were given a random shape and had to make something out of it. 2ND GRADE NEWS

'Tis the season in second grade!! We are so very excited to be in December and all the joy that the season brings. We will be doing some cross curricular unit studies based on the books *The Polar Express* and *How the Grinch Stole Christmas*. There will be lots of grinchy work with plot, opinion writing, and STEM activities!

In math, we are working on solving addition and subtraction word problems with larger numbers. Our next units will be about money and time! To help your child at home, begin practicing identifying the names of the different coins. Did you get some change after buying something? Have your child sort the coins by their type, practice the names, and how much each coin is worth. While driving in the car, practice skip counting by 5s and 10s to help practice counting nickels and dimes!

After winter break, we will be starting cursive!!! Everyone is working so hard to improve their printing skills to be ready to learn cursive next! January and February will bring many new units and many new skills. It's an exciting season!



3RD GRADE NEWS

Third grade is an exciting place to be as we launch into the holiday season! In reading, we've been learning about some of the systems in our bodies. Did you know your body has BILLIONS of nerves? Over the next few months we'll be learning about space, planets, comets, asteroids and other objects flying through space. We'll also be reading about light and sound and how we use both in our daily lives. In math, we're hard at work memorizing math facts. We'll start using those facts soon as we study how to find the area of objects (especially rectangles). After that...it's fraction time! In social studies, we're finishing up a unit on Allegany County and we're looking forward to learning about economics. In science, we're finishing up physics and will soon be learning about water and climate. Third grade wants to wish everyone the happiest of holiday seasons. While we're excited about our upcoming holiday break we're even more excited about getting back to it in 2024!

4TH GRADE NEWS

During the months of January and February, fourth grade will be learning how to solve larger multiplication and division problems using multiple strategies. Be sure to study and memorize your basic facts! In ELA, we will be finishing our study of poetry by reading and interpreting various poems. Then, we will change over to our Geology unit where we will learn about earthquakes and volcanoes. Finally, during Science, we will complete a unit on Energy by studying circuits, magnets, energy transfer, and waves. We will be very busy during these winter months!





5TH GRADE NEWS

Fifth grade has been busy!

In ELA, we have been working on Unit 4 Don Quixote. Students have analyzed pieces of text evidence through different perspectives and used this skill to construct a persuasive essay. They have been hard at work constructing writing pieces that reflect the master writers they are becoming! Next, we will be diving into Unit 5 where students will study the Renaissance and construct an informational writing piece about their favorite artist from that time period.

Students have been working through Unit 2 by adding and subtracting fractions, mixed numbers, and decimals. They then applied their knowledge by solving real world problems using the skills mastered throughout the unit. In Unit 3, students will be multiplying and dividing using fractions and decimals.

Science and social studies have also been busy as students have switch back and forth between Mr. Kinser and Mrs. Winebrenner. In social studies, Mrs. Winebrenner wrapped up the study of the Constitution and separation of powers within our government. Next, students will be exploring the causes, events, and outcomes of the Civil War. In science with Mr. Kinser, students have finished learning about systems and what parts make it function correctly. Students created their own food chains and food webs using nature cards and understanding which represent consumer, producer, and decomposer. Students are now going to be learning about Earth, Sun, and space which will involve topics such as shadows, the Sun's position, and how our solar system operates.




GUIDANCE NEWS

Holiday Greetings Mt. Savage Families from your School Counselor! There is much news from the counselor's curriculum! Classroom lessons are now focusing on the county wide Toolbox Program. This program teaches personal coping skills development and self-management of thoughts, feelings, and behaviors. I will be sending home an overview sheet that covers all 12 tools for you to review and discuss with your child(ren). Students are learning one tool per week. We have already completed the Breathing Tool and are working on the Quiet/Safe Place tool currently. PBIS Chief Citizen is in full swing and students are being recognized for good behavior each week with many of them being honored more than one time! Go Good Behavior!! In January, my school wide Organizational Program will be implemented. Back in September, students received lessons on how to be better organized at school and at home. The school wide program conducts surprise visits to the classroom to check for completion of organizational tasks INCLUDING good attendance of 90% or higher. Please help your child(ren) get to school daily to help support classroom rewards. Students are rewarded on full classroom completion of tasks, not individual. This teaches the students cooperation, teamwork, and kindness to help each other be organized with their tasks. Attendance requires parental cooperation, teamwork, and kindness to help their child(ren) fulfill successful attendance requirements.
