Pre K

Welcome to all of the Pre-K students and their families. We are happy to have you at Cresaptown Elementary School. Pre-K has had a very busy start to the school year. We have been learning all about the school rules and making new friends. Thank you for all your help with transitioning your child to school! We are looking forward to a great school year!

Kindergarten

Kindergarten kiddos have done a great job of adjusting to a full day of school! We have learned all of the school rules and work hard each day to keep it green. We are already practicing our reading skills with our two new words, "I and can." We are also on our way to learning how to write, read and count numbers to 10! Please practice these skills as well as writing your child's name at home to help brush up on these skills! We are busy planning our first field trip of the year to Brookedale Farms! It should be a great day for everyone! Keep up the great job Kinder friends!

First Grade

First graders are very enthusiastic and have been busy learning new routines and making new friends. First graders are excited about learning to read, add and subtract. Students will be using RAZkids and IXL computer programs to practice math facts and Reading and Math concepts. These program monitor individual student progress. First graders should practice math facts and spelling words each night. Students have started bringing home word lists with the sound/pattern they are working on weekly. They should practice reading this list each night. We are also using Class Dojo again this year. We hope all first grade parents sign up and enjoy this monitoring on-line program. Take time to read to your child. Children benefit from being read to by a parent.



Second Grade

Second Grade is having a wonderful start to their school year! In Reading, we have been reviewing short and long vowel sounds. The second graders are also working hard to be fluent readers and can always use extra reading practice at home. Parents, be sure to listen or read along with your child when they read their stories at night. In Math, students are learning and reviewing different addition and subtraction strategies. Second Graders are also trying hard to memorize their math facts by playing math games, studying flash cards, and doing Math Magician on the computer. Please be sure to study math facts with your child nightly. One easy way is to write the problems of the week onto index cards so your child can study the cards at home.

Third Grade

We are continuing to develop our classroom communities and focusing on rules, routines, and responsibilities. Please continue to check Classdojo to monitor your child's progress. In Math, we are working on addition and subtraction strategies. Very soon, we will start multiplication and division. In reading, we have been improving our reading while practicing close reading, developing writing strategies, and using reading strategies. We want to thank all the students and parents for their help in making this year a success.

Media

Kindergarten has learned about the parts of the computer. They have also been learning to be good listeners.

Kindergarteners will learn how to check out books next month. Grade 1 is learning about the web browser we use.

Grades 3, 4, and 5 have reviewed the tools in a word processing program. In
