Recognition of Allegany High School Band


- The Allegany High School Marching Band has set a Maryland record, becoming the first three-time consecutive Atlantic Coast Champions.

Transportation – Inclement Weather Procedures

- When bad weather is predicted, transportation staff are out at 3:00 and 3:30am monitoring air temperatures, currents, and surface conditions at the road level.
 - A decision will be made by 5:00am for a two or three hour delay, or if school will be cancelled completely.
 - Information will go out to the public between 5:30 and 6:00am
 - If a two hour delay is called, road conditions will be reevaluated by 7:00am for complete closings.
 - If a three hour delay is called, road conditions will be reevaluated by 8:00am for complete closings.
 - $_{\odot}\;$ Early dismissal decisions will be made between 10:00 and 11:00am.
 - o Decisions to close the night before will be made no later than 7:30pm.

Elementary Outdoor School Update

- Fifth grade residential outdoor school program
 - This year's outdoor school had over 500 students participating and 134 parent volunteers
 - 12 different lessons to choose from, all aligned with environmental literacy standards for elementary schools
 - o Four educational hikes
 - Daytime activities such as canoeing, fishing, crafts, athletic competitions, and games
 - o Evening activities such as Monday night movies to Thursday night skit nights
 - Ability to teach lessons and activities that can't afford to do in each school because of room and materials
 - Addition of a side by side was great for this year helping with students with physical limitations, so they could participate in activities
